The Centre for Simlipal Studies (CSS), North Orissa University was established in the year 2005. The principal objectives of the centre are to support and carry out research activities on various aspects of Simlipal to safeguard its flora, fauna and microbial resources from future depletion. The Dept. of ATS (Est. 2001), North Orissa University is committed to the cause of tribal development.

About the University

The North Orissa University (NOU) was established in the year 1998 and is included in the list of Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth Universities. The University is also accredited by National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC), with B grade with effect from 10th January, 2017. The territorial jurisdiction of the University covers Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar districts of northern part of Orissa. These two districts are thickly populated with tribal population with an average of 60% inhabitants belonging to the Scheduled Tribes. There are 80 affiliated colleges, both general and professional, catering to the demand of higher education.

About Baripada

The National Seminar is to be held at Baripada, the district headquarter of Mayurbhanj district at the foot hills of Simlipal Biosphere Reserve. The North Orissa University is located in the outskirts of Baripada town. The nearest railway station Baripada is around 60km from Balasore. The nearest airports to Baripada are Bhubaneswar and Kolkata.

About Simlipal Biosphere Reserve



Simlipal Biosphere Reserve is situated in the Mayurbhanj district of Odisha, India covering 5569 km². The Simlipal biosphere reserve includes a Tiger reserve, Elephant Reserve and Kuldiha wild life sanctuary. The area used to be the hunting ground of the Maharajah of Mayurbhanj. The Simlipal forest is the home land for 16 tribes including 4 major primitive vulnerable populations. This is a treasury of indigenous people and medicinal plants as well as for other useful resources. The region has a unique climatic condition and a well sustained ecosystem.
